

An 8-Day Hawaiian Photographic Retreat with *Jack Davis*, and guest presenters; National Geographic Alumni Dewitt Jones and Rikki Cooke October 5th-13th, 2024

⟨→⟩][⟨→ What is this Retreat all about? ⟨→⟩][⟨→⟩ This retreat is about celebrating the intrinsic beauty in our world and in our lives. It is a

week dedicated to sharpening our vision as we shoot and expanding our creative options for enhancing our work after we shoot - giving ourselves permission to fall in love with photography all over again! Recapturing that eagerness and enthusiasm of a child as we explore the endless ways we can integrate creativity into our lives - especially with current camera options and software tools like Lightroom, Photoshop, and even the plethora of mobile photography apps and plug-ins at our disposal! Renowned artist, author, Adobe Master Teacher and Photoshop Hall-of-Famer Jack Davis,

with guest presenters and National Geographic alumni Dewitt Jones and Rikki Cooke, will once again (for over 20 years now!) teach a creative photography and digital imagery workshop retreat at the beautiful Hui Ho'olana Center on the incredible island of Moloka'i, Hawai'i. Whether you are a professional photographer, an addicted amateur or someone just deliriously giddy about shooting and enhancing with your smartphone (as we are ;), this week is for you! And while we explore Moloka'i, we'll also explore new ways to shoot and shape your

photography by allowing your eyes to play through the camera, and your hands to work through the computer (or mobile apps for that matter) to shape your images in ways you never thought possible. Learn new methods to craft that visual "story" you've always wanted to tell but may never have had the time, opportunity, skills or permission to before. Learn steps to optimize, enhance, creatively interpret and share your images using everything

from the latest 2024 Lightroom, Photoshop and third-party plug-ins, to the plethora of mobile apps and A.I. technologies that are daily introducing new ways to stretch the creative process.



One way to think about the "Soulish" part of the creative process is with questions like these:

What's in Your Heart? The Inspiration Before you Shoot How far you take your photography (and indeed, your life) has everything to do with how far you have given yourself permission to go. This "permission," - and the openness to

experiment with your visual images and the stories they tell - starts long before you take out your camera. The goal of slowing down and preparing yourself before you shoot is that you will be able to take the depth (and enjoyment!) of your art to the next level. **What's in Your Hand?** The Experimentation with **How** you Shoot This idea is to focus on what photographic tools, in-field shooting techniques and compositional ways of shaping a scene you can employ to create a unique and powerful image

Panoramas, HDR, motion blurs, time lapse, etc., all of which can be done with a DSLR, a Pointn-Shoot, or even a smartphone! (Yes... even our night shooting of the Milky Way can now be

done with some of the latest mobile alchemy!)

that reflects not only what you saw with your eye, but were feeling inside, or what you would like your audience to feel. Example techniques include using a macro or fisheye lens, shooting

What's in Your Head? The Execution of your Vision After You've Shot Just as in the days of the traditional darkroom, the storytelling process doesn't stop with the camera, but only after the image is incarnated into something that can be viewed and shared in all its intended glory. And now more than ever, the capability to create imagery to create art, that would never be possible with just a camera alone—is limitless. This stage of creativity explores simple yet powerful ways of tweaking, retouching, enhancing, combining and even digitally painting one's photographs to go beyond what was captured to expressing what was felt, or what we the photographer want the viewer to feel.


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Jack Davis is one of the world's leading experts on Photoshop,

Davis was also one of the first inductees into the Photoshop Hall of Fame for his lifetime contributions to the industry, and is designated an Adobe Master Teacher. He has an AA and BA in Graphic Design, and an MA and MFA in Digital Imagery.



The main Lodge is secluded on 100 acres, surrounded by a spectacular view of the western half of Moloka'i, the Pacific Ocean and distant islands. A beautiful rock-framed tiled swimming pool and organic garden complement the grounds. Watching rainbows dance across the island, or the sun sink behind Mounaloa (sacred birthplace of the hula), or the rising of the galactic center of the

Milky Way from the front porch are some of the truly unforgettable experiences of our week


